Drug Testing:

B.R.A.S.S. will work with individuals to complete their high school education by helping them obtain a GED and guidance for their future education.

Life Skills:

B.R.A.S.S. can assist individuals in recovery learn life skills such as; computer skills, balancing a checkbook, completing rental applications and building a resume.

Presentation "A Son Lost To Addiction; How Does That Happen?":

"Joey's Story" chronicles the events of a young man, who began experimenting with drugs at a young age. What he thought was a fun, cool and recreational thing to do, developed into something much bigger than he was, with devastating results.

Placement Assistance:

B.R.A.S.S. will work with families and individuals struggling with addiction to help them find a detox and/or rehab program that best fits their needs.

Support Groups:

Through our dedicated location, we will offer weekly Alcoholics Anonymous & Narcotics Anonymous meetings, support for grandparents raising grandchildren, grief support, peer to peer counseling and children/teen support services.
