Over the years, Karen has been a part of TBH teams in Registration, Data Entry/Computers, Finance, and Patient Financial Services. And from 2001 to the present, she has taught yoga fitness classes, both for the hospital and community.

Although she never planned on making TBH her lifetime job, "the grass is not always greener anywhere else," noted Karen, who, along with her late husband Mark, raised three children just seven minutes from home to work. "I was making \$3 an hour when I was hired. It just made sense to stay after I started accumulating seniority."

Karen shared some memories from her time at TBH concerning how healthcare has changed over the years:

- We used to supply patient discharges and births to the local radio and newspaper.
- You rarely saw a lifeflight helicopter and now they are a regular occurrence, which is a good thing in times of emergency.
- At the old hospital, we had no registration after 11:30 p.m. Now, it is 24/7.
- Back in the day, people were allowed to smoke inside the hospital and in the lunchroom.

  Ohio hospitals are now tobacco-free.

In retirement, Karen plans to focus on her children and grandchildren, and her hobbies of yoga, sewing and crafting, and will also handcraft draw-string bags for foster children to use when they move from place to place. One piece of advice Karen would offer new employees? "Put money in your retirement fund as soon as possible. It is the best thing you can do for yourself."

# **TBH Provides Cancer Care Services**

Did you know that The Bellevue Hospital (TBH) provides Cancer Care Services conveniently located for Bellevue residents and those in surrounding areas? This service is located on the first floor of the hospital and consists of a physician-led hematology/oncology office, directed by Apoorva Chawla, M.D. The expert staff at TBH offers treatments such as chemotherapy and immunotherapy, which uses the patient's own immune system to combat cancer.

"In the past 18 months, the Cancer Care and Infusion Services Department has grown significantly," said Loretta Nichols, department director. "We have added an additional office day for Dr. Chawla and will soon be expanding our space and services."

Nichols also stated, "We offer timely appointments with no delays and also collaborate with higher acuity facilities such as Ohio State, Cleveland Clinic, and the University of Toledo Medical Center. Self-referrals are also accepted if there is an oncology or hematology diagnosis. We know that cancer/infusion patients prefer to stay close to home, so we are advocates of the 'your

hospital, your choice' mantra when it comes to patient care."

Dr. Chawla is board certified in internal medicine and medical oncology by the American Board of Medical Specialties, specializing in breast cancer, lung cancer, and gastrointestinal cancers. With nearly a decade of experience, he graduated with distinction from Cornell University, earning a Bachelor of Science degree, and later obtained his Doctor of Medicine degree from Indiana University School of Medicine. Dr. Chawla completed his internal medicine residency at Harvard Medical School's Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center and pursued a clinical fellowship in Hematology/Oncology at The University of Chicago Medical Center.

Infusion services are also offered, and include IV antibiotics and infusions for conditions such as multiple sclerosis, ulcerative colitis, Crohn's, osteoporosis, and blood transfusions, among others. "We can administer those infusions right here in Bellevue, as long as we have an order for the patient from any licensed provider," noted Nichols. "No need to go out-of-town anymore!"
